Nurşin Ateşoğlu Güney

Prof. Dr. Nurşin Ateşoğlu Güney is professor of IR in Bahcesehir University and member of Turkey's Presidential Security and Foreign Policies Council. She is President of CEMES, the Center of Mediterranean Security, a university-based think-tank and vice president at Wise Men Center for Strategic Studies (BILGESAM), an Istanbul based think-tank. She is also member of IISS. Prof Güney has been part of many second track diplomacy initiatives. Her research interests cover energy politics, security issues, current world affairs, non-proliferation and disarmament, American, Russian and Turkish foreign policy. She is commenting on national and international broadcasting, writing analysis in daily newspapers and monthly political journals on a regular basis. She has published numerous scholarly books and articles, one of the latest is her edited book entitled *New Geopolitical Realities for Russia, from the Black Sea to the Mediterranean*, Lexington Publishers (London, September 2019).

Vişne Korkmaz

Prof. Dr. Vişne Korkmaz is professor of IR in Bahcesehir University. She is vice-director of CEMES, Center of Mediterranean Security, a university based think-tank. Prof. Dr. Korkmaz has given lectures at the National Defense University of the Turkish Republic on current affairs and regional security issues in the Middle East, Russia and Caucasus. Her research interests cover IR theories, FP theories, regional security and security issues, Russian, American and Turkish foreign policy. She is author of several books and has published a number of scholarly papers, chapters and articles on these issues, including newly launched chapters "New Russian Mahanism Failed: Futile Geopolitical Dreams in the Black Sea and Mediterranean" (with Nursin Güney) and "Russia and Turkey: Interdependence in the Time of Hybrid Mahanism" (with Nursin and Eda Güney), in *New Geopolitical Realities for Russia, from the Black Sea to the Mediterranean*, Lexington Publishers (London, September 2019).

Eda Güney

Eda Güney has received her MA degree from Bordeaux International Relations Degree of Sciences Po Bordeaux. She participated in an exchange semester at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey during her MA degree and took classes from the Institute's Master of Arts in Nonproliferation and Terrorism Studies Program. She also participated in the 2018 International Summer School "Energy Infrastructure and Policy Repercussions" organized by Masaryk University, Faculty of Social Studies, Department of International Relations and European Studies, held in Telč, in August 2018. Her area of focus is nuclear non-proliferation, nuclear energy and energy security. In addition to her academic studies, Ms. Güney also has an NGO background. She worked as a volunteer at the Youth Atlantic Treaty Association (YATA) for many years. With YATA she participated in international conferences in Turkey and abroad. Ms. Güney wrote her master's dissertation on extended deterrence and nuclear non-proliferation with a focus on Turkey. Currently, she is involved with the Bordeaux Institute of International Cybersecurity Studies (BIICS) as a Community Manager and making her PhD in the field of IR at Istanbul Medeniyet University.
