Paper Title	Two Perspectives on Two Museums in Qatar

PROPOSAL TEXT (250-500 WORDS)

This paper seeks to contribute two provisionally underdeveloped vantage points on museums in Arabia. The paper — combining these two essays — draws on an ethnographic foundation of evidence, and principally focuses upon several of the new museums in Doha, Qatar.

With numerous museums under construction in Qatar, scholars have been engaged in substantial discussion concerning the articulation of an historical narrative in the new National Museum of Qatar, and how that narrative might serve the interests of various stakeholders in the demographic spectrum resident on the peninsula. In the first portion of this paper, I consider how those various stakeholders are served by the museum as a material political-economic object. Recognizing the museum foremost as a significant state expenditure, I suggest the museum should be apprehended as one of a constellation of urban megaprojects. In a rentier ecosystem configured around the economy of urban development, those megaprojects are vital, keystone features that drive the economy of urban development. That urban economy gives order and purpose to the financial conduits that flow from state to citizenry, and to a constellation of other stakeholders who feed on the same capital flows. Museums are thus key features in the substrate of activities that maintain political legitimacy in the contemporary Gulf state.

The system of relations described in the first portion of this paper, while primarily configured to serve relations between state and citizenry, also incorporate a variety of external stakeholders, and it is through this matrix of historical and contemporary relations that coherent frameworks of ideas and understandings cross cultural thresholds. The second portion of this essay is concerned with the traffic in the ideosphere cultivated by the economy of urban development and, more specifically, by the construction of museums in Doha. This argument commences with the articulation of the theoretical concept of a social prism — an historically contextualized and culturally specific paradigm for subdividing the continuum of human diversity characteristic of all human societies. In one sense or another, all museums promote a social prism of some sort or pedigree. But through a discussion and analysis of two museums in Qatar, I suggest that we can discern the differential impact of a singular and western social prism on the narrative trajectory therein, and simultaneously recognize the social prism interwoven in these museums' narratives as the last vestiges of an eroding Western imperialism, albeit cloaked in the trappings of social justice.
