The Gulf Research Meeting - July 2024, Cambridge

The Gulf Research Center (GRC) hosted its 14th annual Gulf Research Meeting (GRM) in Cambridge from July 9-11, 2024, attended by over 400 experts, scholars, and practitioners. The event's participants were spread out over 13 workshops overseen by 29 workshop directors. The workshops covered a host of issues ranging from security and conflict resolution to AI and climate change related to the Gulf region. The Gulf Research Meeting seeks to hold academic meetings that lead to publications on topics related to social sciences with a focus on the Gulf region. GRM Opening Ceremony moderated by GRC Director of Research Dr. Christian Koch and included welcoming remarks by Dr. Abdulaziz Sager, Chairman of the GRC, and Prof. David Cardwell, Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Strategy and Planning at the University of Cambridge. This was followed by speeches from H.H. Prince Faisal bin Farhan Al-Saud, Foreign Minister of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, H.E. Mr. Jasem Mohamed Albudaiwi, Secretary General of the Cooperation Council for the Arab States of the Gulf. H.E. The Rt Hon Patricia Scotland KC, Secretary-General of the Commonwealth, and H.E. Mr. Luigi Di Maio, European Union Special Representative (EUSR) for the Gulf region.

GRM 2024 Keynote Speakers









The second half of the opening ceremony featured a panel discussion with three distinguished women from the Gulf region, and was moderated by Dr. Christian Koch, GRC's Director of Research. Panel speakers included H.E. Sheikha Jawaher Ebrahim Duaij Al-Sabah, Assistant Foreign Minister for Human Rights, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, State of Kuwait, who shared insights on the role of women in peace and diplomacy, with a focus on human rights issues; H.E. Ambassador Nancy Jamal, Chief of Strategic Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Kingdom of Bahrain, who discussed her experiences in counter-terrorism, preventing extremism, and developing frameworks for sustainable security; and H.E. Dr. Manal Radwan, Advisor at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, who reflected on her involvement in high-level security discussions and the evolving international political landscape.

Dr. Abdulaziz Sager, Chairman of the Gulf Research Center (GRC), welcomed all guests and participants and remarked on the challenges facing the region and the importance of "building bridges, allowing for spaces where discussions and exchange of views can occur." He stated that it was important to keep "an open door for a wide array of individuals and institutions to engage in deliberations that can overcome existing obstacles" through events such as the GRM.

Professor David Cardwell, Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Strategy and Planning at the University of Cambridge, warmly welcomed attendees to the GRM, highlighting the importance of collaboration, especially in light of current global conflicts. He noted the University of Cambridge's active engagement with the Gulf region through various academic and cultural initiatives and emphasized the critical need for research and dialogue on issues like economic diversification, climate change, and artificial intelligence. He concluded by expressing optimism for productive discussions and new collaborations during the conference.



In his virtual address at the opening ceremony of the Gulf Research Meeting, H.H. Prince Faisal bin Farhan, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, emphasized the importance of intellectual discourse in order to better understand regional dynamics. He stressed the need for a rules-based international order to prevent chaos and conflict, urging a commitment to international law and peaceful dispute resolution. H.H. Prince Faisal highlighted Saudi Arabia's dedication to regional stability, cooperation, and economic prosperity. He also called for an immediate ceasefire and renewed dialogue to resolve the Palestinian conflict, advocating for justice, equality, and mutual respect. Access the full speech here.

In his keynote speech, H.E. Mr. Jasem AlBudaiwi. Secretary General of the Cooperation Council for the Arab States of the Gulf, highlighted the relevance of the Gulf Research Meeting as a crucial platform for dialogue on all issues pertaining to Gulf regional affairs. Access the full speech here.

In her keynote address, the Rt Hon Patricia Scotland KC Secretary-General of the Commonwealth emphasized the importance of international cooperation in addressing global challenges. Highlighting the roles of international organizations like the Commonwealth, H.E. detailed various initiatives undertaken by the Commonwealth aimed at sustainable development, climate resilience, and environmental stewardship. These include the Common Sensing Programme for disaster management, the Blue Charter for ocean conservation, the Common Earth Initiative for nature-based climate solutions, and the Clean Ocean Initiative to tackle marine plastic pollution. The Secretary-General of the Commonwealth also introduced the Climate Finance Access Hub and the Common Space Initiative, which explores the potential of space technology for sustainable development. The overarching message was a call for unity and collaboration to build a sustainable, peaceful, and prosperous world. Access the full speech here.

In his keynote speech, H.E. Luigi Di Maio, the EU Special Representative for the Gulf Region, highlighted the importance of the EU-GCC strategic partnership. He emphasized the need for trust, collaboration, and the fulfillment of promises to achieve sustainable peace and prosperity. H.E. Di Maio emphasized the significance of diplomatic maturity in discussing shared understandings and differences, and he spoke about the transformative power of human connections. In terms of EU-GCC ties, he highlighted the potential milestone of a first-ever EU-GCC Summit to be held later in 2024, which he believes could be vital for shared security, prosperity, and global stability in these uncertain times. At the same time, he condemned threats to international navigation and maritime security as have recently occurred in the Red Sea. Access the full speech here.




GLMM

In July 2024, the International Labour Organisation (ILO) published a regional report and twelve country reports (in English and Arabic) as the result of a joint project of the ILO/Regional Office for Arab States (ROAS) and the Gulf Labour Markets, Migration, and Population (GLMM) programme assessing the labour migration statistics for the 6 GCC and 6 other Arab



Mashreq countries. Access the full report here.

The regional and country reports were drafted by a core team of experts of the GLMM under the auspices of the Gulf Research Centre Foundation (GCRF) in Geneva. GRC Releases Annual Strategic Survey 2024

The Gulf Research Center (GRC) launched its Annual Strategic Survey on July 4, 2024. The chapters in this volume seek to provide some insight into how the Gulf countries have perceived the changing regional and international scene and how their role is central to the outcome of the developments taking place.

Key developments stand out when one looks at the Gulf's strategic environment and position as of 2024. The Gulf region continues to grapple with the devastating crisis in Gaza and the strategic repercussions it has had for the Middle East as a whole and puts the GCC states in a difficult position. The tragic events of October 7 were a stark reminder that stability in the region cannot be achieved until a just and equitable solution to the Palestinian issue culminating in the establishment of a Palestinian state is achieved. Unfortunately, the conflict continues unabated with the current Israeli government displaying absolutely no willingness to undertake the necessary steps towards a resolution to the crisis. This undermines not only regional stability but also highlights the failure of the wider international community to push for and implement a needed response.

This volume also delves into the various focus issues that have emerged as key priorities when it comes to the Gulf, ranging from the security of the Red Sea, the question of reform of the GCC, the Gulf's relations with Asia, in addition to key developments and challenges for the GCC labor markets.

The Gulf Research Center's goal is to foster informed dialogue and policy-making by presenting data and analyses that reflect the perspectives and priorities of the GCC states.








